Introductory Workshop on Medieval Indian Coins

The emphasis of this introductory Course is on Identification of various coin types that were issued during the Sultanate and Mughal period in India, the types of inscriptions found on them and the method of classification for these coins. The course will mainly focus on the coins of Delhi Sultanates, Provincial Sultanate and Mughals. It will include some practical session, wherein the participants will work on the actual coins, and lectures on the relevant topic with Power Point Presentation.
